The TBK Foundation & 160 Years of TBK

Temple B'rith Kodesh was founded October 9, 1848 by A. Adler, Jacob and Joseph Altman, Jacob Ganz, Joseph Katz, Harry Leve, Samuel Marks, Meyer Rothschild, Abraham Weinberg, Joseph and Gabriel Wile and Elias Wolf, on the third floor of #2 Front Street. In 1856 we moved into what was the Tabernacle Baptist Church at St. Paul and Andrews Streets. The building was enlarged and was used until 1894. Then, with the help of Henry Michaels, we raised enough money (during economic hard times) to build the Gibbs Street sanctuary. Our congregation prospered there from 1894 until 1962, when Rabbi Bernstein, Isaac Gordon, Abe Feinbloom, Garson Meyer, Ben Goldstein, Emanuel Goldberg, Max Farash and others came together to motivate the congregation to build our current building.

Where do we go from here? What will our congregation be like in 10, 20 or 100 years? The future depends on us. The Temple B'rith Kodesh Foundation was created for the sole purpose of supporting what we do now and what we want for the future. As some of you know, since my last Bulletin column I was blessed to have the opportunity to attend the annual conference of Reform Rabbis in Jerusalem. It was the first time I had been back to Israel in nearly a decade. From the moment I arrived, I remembered so many things I hadn't thought about for years. I remembered how nearly every street is named for a rabbi, a Jewish sage or an important leader. I remembered the way Israelis hold eye contact when you pass them on the street. I remembered the singular deliciousness of Café Hafuch ... just imagine a cappuccino flipped upside down!

From the moment I arrived, I was also overwhelmed by all I had forgotten. I had forgotten that you'll find a cup for ritual hand washing alongside the sink of most public restrooms. I forgot how it feels to hear "Shabbat Shalom" in the grocery store on a Friday morning. Most of all I had forgotten how singularly bewitching Israel is. I don't know how else to explain it. I had forgotten how this other home of ours enters the soul.

Midway through the week, our group attended a performance by an Israeli theater company called *Nalaga'at*, or "please touch." Everyone in this company has some level of hearing or visual impairment. In the particular piece they did for us, called *Not By Bread Alone*, they worked together to create a world on that stage that was mesmerizing, funny, and surreal. Seeing volunteers seamlessly guided blind players to their places. Hearing volunteers helped convey the deaf players' narration. It was an

unforgettable hour. The actors transported us into their universe, allowing us an intimate glimpse of how they process the world, of what makes them feel isolated or sad, of what brings them joy. Like café hafuch - the upside down coffee I adore - these performers turned convention on its ear. Suddenly we who hear and see were the ones not in charge. And they were the ones who had the power to tell us what it was like to walk in their shoes ... if only for a little while.

Yom Ha'Atzmaut

Only in Israel? Maybe not. Yet there was something about this play that felt as though it couldn't have happened in quite the same way someplace else. This is a country that is finding compelling and creative ways to care for its disenfranchised. To make sure that the voiceless have a voice. To build connections and foster dignity among those who could so easily be forgotten, and too often are.

How I would love to see us take an extra measure of pride in that, during this season of celebrating Israel's birthday. The next time we are confronted with images of the land of Israel that would cause us to think it is a monolithic place filled only with violence and war, may we remember how many untold stories there are, lying in wait. As a matter of fact, our congregational trip to Israel is returning to Rochester right about now. Let's begin by asking to hear theirs!

One of their daughters, Grace Lillian Landsberg, married Harry Leiter. They lived in Rochester and belonged to Temple B'rith Kodesh.

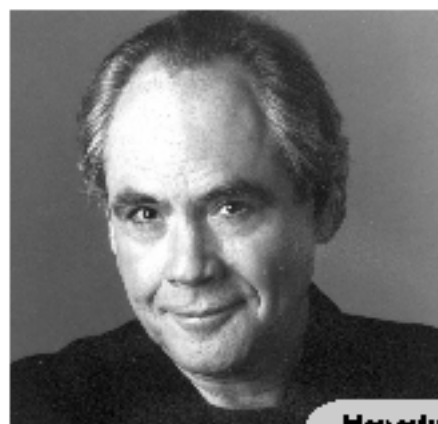

17. Pause to sing Havdallah as Shabbat ends on Saturday.

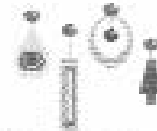

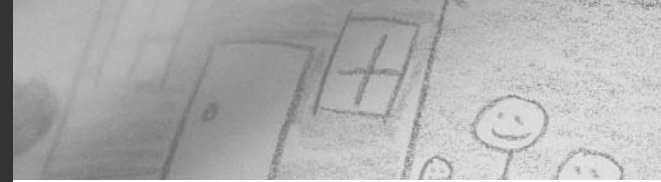
